Supporters of clean energy say **we have a basic responsibility to leave a better world for our children and we can't do that unless we** reduce pollution from dirty energy sources like coal and methane gas. Methane gas pollution is 80 times more potent than carbon pollution when it comes to disrupting our climate, and burning methane gas produces tons of toxic air pollution that causes asthma, heart disease, and even cancer. On the other hand, clean energy like wind and solar is pollution-free and uses only 4% of the amount of water that fossil fuel plants do. And clean energy not only has the potential to create thousands of quality jobs but also costs about half as **much as electricity from gas. And with new advances in energy storage, we can now produce wind and solar power when it's cheapest and then use it when it's needed.**

Opponents of clean energy say with the cost of living so out of control, the last thing we need is a woke, liberal government turning its back on traditional energy sources like natural gas, which have provided stable and affordable power and employed Americans for generations. Forcing us to use expensive and unproven sources like wind and solar will cause more blackouts, raise our utility bills, and **hurt our economy. Solar panels might work for wealthy communities but don't work for the average person - it's not fair to force every** Arizonan to pay higher energy bills just so wealthy people can have solar panels - especially when most solar panels are made in China using slave labor and when the building and transportation of these technologies actually creates more carbon pollution than they save.
