



2025 Indiana Radon Poster Contest

Opportunity for Students

Radon is a colorless, odorless, tasteless, radioactive gas produced by the natural decay of uranium in the soil. Exposure to elevated radon levels increases the risk of developing lung cancer. Radon is the leading cause of lung cancer among non-smokers and is the number one cause of death in homes, surpassing falls, poisoning, fires, choking, and drowning. Approximately 1 in 3 homes tested have radon levels at or above the EPA action level of 4.0 pCi/L in Indiana. By participating in this activity, students will learn about radon and how to reduce their risk of exposure.

To help spread the message about radon's health hazards, the Indiana State Department of Health along with the American Lung Association, host a statewide **Indiana Radon Poster Contest**. We are once again calling on Indiana citizens **ages 9-14** to create a radon poster that will increase public awareness of radon gas and encourage other Indiana citizens to test their homes.

A state committee will select the top three winning posters from the entire state of Indiana to receive awards.

1st place winner will receive \$200
2nd place winner will receive \$150
3rd place winner will receive \$100

Poster Guidelines

Topics: *(Please use one of the following set topics as a "theme" for your poster)*

- What is radon?
- Where does radon come from?
- How does radon get into our homes?
- Radon can cause lung cancer
- Test your home for radon

What the judges are looking for:

- Accuracy of poster content
- Correct spelling
- Reproducibility of poster
- Originality of poster
(Does not resemble a past winner)
- Poster is aesthetically pleasing

Requirements:

- Be original
- Student's name is not on the front
- Topic and title must be on the Artwork Submission Form (1 copy included!)
- White paper – size 8.5x11 required
- Can be created with crayon, markers, paint, collage, photographs or computer graphics
- Lettering and message should be large enough to reproduce well.
- All pencil markings erased
- Copyrighted characters, product logos and trademarked or brand names cannot be used
